### Get Ready for Harry

Take the Library's Harry Potter Trivia Challenge for a Chance to Win a Book

**July 6, 2007** – The Stark County District Library staff is getting ready for the release of the final book of the Harry Potter series with a **Harry Potter Trivia Challenge**. The Trivia Challenge is open to all ages, and patrons who complete it will be entered into drawings for copies of *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows*.

Stop by any library location to take the Harry Potter Trivia Challenge, or visit the library's website at [www.starklibrary.org](http://www.starklibrary.org) and download a copy. Completed Trivia Challenge forms are due at any library location by Monday July 16, 2007. Each library location will hold a drawing of completed Trivia Challenges to determine the winners of a copy of the seventh and final book.

Winners will be notified by phone, and may pick up their copy of *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows* at the library's **Harry's Midnight Madness**, an event for all ages on July 20-21, from 10:00 pm to 1:00 am, at the Plain Community Branch, 1803 Schneider Street NE, where the library will become Hogwarts Castle. Starting at 12:01 am on the 21<sup>st</sup>, winners of the Trivia Challenge, plus library patrons who have been notified by phone that their hold for *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows* is available, will receive their copies of the book.

The Stark County District Library is one of the best 100 libraries in the United States, ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in its population category. Its Main Library, 10 Branch Libraries, and two bookmobiles and two Kidmobiles serve 143,000 library card holders. More than 1.4 million people visited the Main Library or its Branches and Bookmobiles last year. Holdings number more than 925,000 items, and annual circulation is 3.8 million items. The collection includes books, audio visual materials, and periodicals for all ages. In addition, the Library provides programs and classes for adults, teens, and children, computer and Internet access, inter-library loans, reference and genealogy services, and traveling collections on two Bookmobiles and two Kidmobiles, as well as Outreach services to shut-ins, nursing homes, and housing units. It is one of the nine largest library systems in the state of Ohio, serving 12 local school districts.
