**April 14, 2008** – [Learn the basics of applying for grants](#) and how the foundation system works on Thursday, April 24, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm at the Stark County District Library, 715 Market Avenue N, Canton. This class, which will be held in the Main library's McKinley Room, will focus on finding funding sources and how to write a successful grant request.

Mark Guyer, fundraising coordinator for the library, and author of *A Concise Guide To Getting Grants for Nonprofit Organizations* will present the class which is free. Due to space limitations, pre-registration for this educational session is requested by calling 330.458.2758.

#### **About the Library:**

The [Stark County District Library](#) is one of the best 100 libraries in the United States.
