## {Book of the Month}

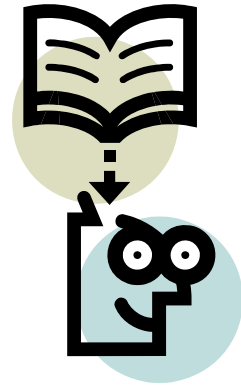
