



# Native American Heritage Month

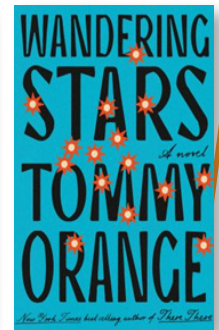
